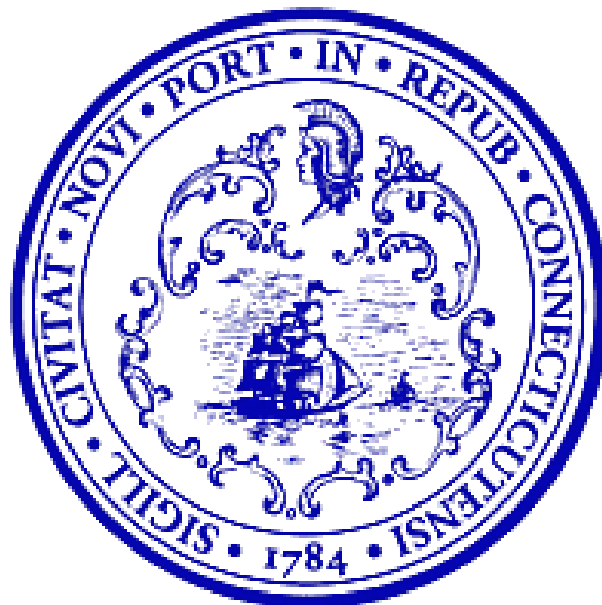

As Alders representing Wards 27 and 30, respectively, we are submitting the attached Order for Unanimous Consent to approve rolling street closures associated with the West Hills Community Parade on Saturday, May 25th, 2024, from 12 Noon to 2:00 P.M.

The ORDER OF THE NEW HAVEN BOARD OF ALDERS APPROVING THE ROLLING CLOSURE OF BLAKE STREET TO VALLEY STREET, EMERSON STREET TO VALLEY STREET, WEST HILLS ROAD TO VALLEY STREET, STRONG STREET TO VALLEY STREET, VALLEY PLACE NORTH TO VALLEY STREET, VALLEY PLACE SOUTH TO VALLEY STREET, PARKSIDE DRIVE TO VALLEY STREET, VICTORY DRIVE TO VALLEY STREET, EAST RAMSDELL STREET TO VALLEY STREET, MOUNTAIN ROAD TO VALLEY STREET, VALLEY STREET TO HARPER AVE, HARPER AVE TO GENESEE STREET, AND HARPER AVE TO SOUTH GENESEE STREET TO ACCOMMODATE THE WEST HILLS COMMUNITY PARADE ON MAY 25TH, 2024, FROM 12 NOON TO 2:00 P.M.

Alders representing Wards 27 and 30 will hold a West Hills Community Parade in New Haven on Saturday, May 25th, 2024, from 12 noon to 2:00 p.m.

The parade will begin at Blake Street to Valley Street, Emerson Street to Valley Street, West Hills Road to Valley Street, Strong Street to Valley Street, Valley Place North to Valley Street, Valley Place South to Valley Street, Parkside Drive to Valley Street, Victory Drive to Valley Street, East Ramsdell Street to Valley Street, Mountain Road to Valley Street, Valley Street to Harper Ave, Harper Ave to Genesee Street, and Harper Ave until reaching its endpoint on South Genesee Street.

The streets affected are major roadways with a bus route that requires the full Board of Alders' approval.

It is estimated that 250 participants and onlookers are expected to turn out for the parade, which symbolizes a return to a sense of 'normal' and a gathering of neighbors to enjoy, celebrate, and connect on a day of unity and togetherness. 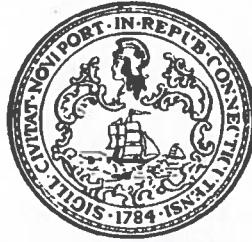

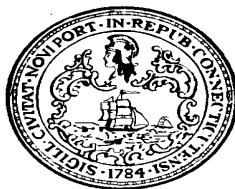

WHEREAS: Dr. Ann E. Garrett Robinson was born in Greenville, North Carolina, on June 8, 1934, moved to New Haven in 1967, and has been a resident of New Haven since then; and

WHEREAS: Dr. Robinson's passion, love, and genuine care for all is something that was admired by many residents in the community; she has dedicated herself to helping and giving in any capacity to her community; and

WHEREAS: in April 1970, she and her family relocated to 406 Dixwell Avenue, making her one of the longest-living residents of the Dixwell Neighborhood, and

WHEREAS: Dr. Robinson attended North Carolina Central University in Durham, North Carolina, graduating with a Bachelor of Art in Psychology, and she went on to earn her Master's in Clinical Psychology from Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, her doctorate in Education from Nova Southeastern University, Fort Lauderdale, Florida; and

WHEREAS: she earned her doctorate with her award-winning dissertation on service and learning called "The Effects of a Community Service-Oriented Curriculum on Alienation, Perceived Student Role and Course Satisfaction in Community College students," which was translated into several languages; and

WHEREAS: she was a pioneer in the City of New Haven, starting in 1967 as the first black certified Psychological Examiner, as a school psychologist for New Haven Public Schools, even for the State of Connecticut, and she was in the first group of women on the faculty of Yale, servicing as a Research Assistant at the Yale Child Study Center; and

WHEREAS: in the 1970's, she began her legendary teaching career; she became a Professor Emerita at Gateway Community College for 27 years, teaching psychology and cultural anthropology; and










On behalf of our Together New Haven team members, I am pleased to submit for your consideration three orders which, taken together, will launch the BioCity Initiative at 101 College Street.

You will recall at the outset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Board of Alders supported our small businesses through marketing, technical assistance and business strategy all in an effort to “bounce back” stronger. Change is now visible on the ground, and through innovation. Biotechs related to the Yale School of Medicine, like BioHaven, Arvinas and AztraZeneca, are bringing new treatments to market. The ideas coming out of our community are changing lives across the world. As part of this journey, we worked together to launch the 101 College Street project, recognizing that it was important to for us to look toward the future and build a strong foundation for job growth.

That commitment to inclusive growth remains at the forefront. With your support and guidance, employers, teachers and workforce partners are connecting residents to opportunity across any number of growing fields. The BioCity initiative is an important next step by connecting New

Haven Public School (NHPS) students to the highest levels of scientific research and the meaningful work happening here in our city. Some of the key operational plan highlights for BioCity include,

- **Program Infrastructure:** BioCity will offer a robust educational experience focusing on industry immersion, combining expert instruction with real-world biotech applications. Students will have opportunities to earn dual enrollment credits and gain hands-on experience in a shared lab environment, thereby enhancing both academic and practical skills.
- **Staffing Outlook:** A diverse team including educators specializing in Chemistry and Math as well as career coaching will lead the program, ensuring comprehensive support and high-quality instruction for the students.
- **Student Onboarding and Engagement:** The onboarding process is designed to set clear academic and behavioral expectations while emphasizing safety and professionalism. A summer “Boot Camp” will launch this year. It is an integral part of student preparation, promoting early engagement and community building.
- **Recruitment and Application Process:** There is a focused recruitment effort from select high schools and a clear, accessible application process aim to attract a diverse group of academically driven students. The process emphasizes transparency and inclusivity, with an essay component allowing candidates to showcase their individuality and potential. Specifically, outreach efforts will focus on James Hillhouse Comprehensive High School, Hill Regional Career High School, and Wilbur Cross High School
- **Strategic Partnerships and Collaboration:** The program integrates with local educational and industry leaders to align with New Haven’s economic goals and leverage the area’s rich bioscience resources. This collaboration is set to enhance educational outcomes and ensure that students are well-prepared for biotech careers.
- **Boot Camp and Innovative Programs:** The BioCity program includes the aforementioned preparatory boot camp at CT State Gateway Campus (Gateway) and the BioPath Innovation Camp at Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU). These initiatives offer hands-on learning experiences across various scientific disciplines, preparing students for their academic and professional futures in bioscience.

With the federal grant award in place, we are now in a position to bring all of the agreements to the Board for its consideration. The communication has three orders summarized as follows,

- (1) a license and use agreement with BioLabs, which includes exclusive use of the classroom and lab along with non-exclusive use of the common space. Carter Winstanley and the

local leadership at BioLabs have been extremely supportive of this initiative and have developed state-of-the-art environment for our students.

- (2) the acceptance of the \$1.5M grant made possible by our federal delegation through the Fiscal Year 2023 Congressional Discretionary process. We have now received the instructions from the US Department of Education to complete the technical application, which is due in early June. This funding will cover both capital and operational costs.
- (3) a \$1.5M American Rescue Plan Career Pathways allocation for use by NHPS, first to cover operational costs and articulation agreements with our partners from Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU) and CT State Gateway Campus (Gateway) that may be associated with BioCity. The balance would be available for any other science-related career pathways, building on the existing momentum at NHPS.

Consistent with President Biden’s Executive Order 13985 on Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities through the Federal Government, the City has underscored the racial wealth gap and opportunities to create intergenerational wealth through the recovery process. The classroom and labs at 101 College Street will be fully furnished and equipped to professional standards, thereby creating a lasting sense of belonging, aspiration and access, all in keeping with the Executive Order.

Already due to the great work of New Haven Public Schools, 15 students have been admitted to the program. The goal is to start the program with an off-site summer camp and then the first cohort would go to 101 College in September, 2024.

Students will have opportunities to earn dual enrollment credits and gain hands-on experience in a shared lab environment, thereby enhancing both academic and practical skills.
- **Staffing Outlook:** A diverse team including educators specializing in Chemistry and Math as well as career coaching will lead the program, ensuring comprehensive support and high-quality instruction for the students.
- **Student Onboarding and Engagement:** The onboarding process is designed to set clear academic and behavioral expectations while emphasizing safety and professionalism. A summer “Boot Camp” will launch this year. It is an integral part of student preparation, promoting early engagement and community building.
- **Recruitment and Application Process:** There is a focused recruitment effort from select high schools and a clear, accessible application process aim to attract a diverse group of academically driven students. The process emphasizes transparency and inclusivity, with an essay component allowing candidates to showcase their individuality and potential. Specifically, outreach efforts will focus on James Hillhouse Comprehensive High School, Hill Regional Career High School, and Wilbur Cross High School
- **Strategic Partnerships and Collaboration:** The program integrates with local educational and industry leaders to align with New Haven’s economic goals and leverage the area’s rich bioscience resources. This collaboration is set to enhance educational outcomes and ensure that students are well-prepared for biotech careers.
- **Boot Camp and Innovative Programs:** The BioCity program includes the aforementioned preparatory boot camp at CT State Gateway Campus (Gateway) and the BioPath Innovation Camp at Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU). These initiatives offer hands-on learning experiences across various scientific disciplines, preparing students for their academic and professional futures in bioscience.

With the federal grant award in place, we are now in a position to bring all of the agreements to the Board for its consideration. The communication has three orders summarized as follows,

- (1) a license and use agreement with BioLabs, which includes exclusive use of the classroom and lab along with non-exclusive use of the common space. Carter Winstanley and the

local leadership at BioLabs have been extremely supportive of this initiative and have developed state-of-the-art environment for our students.

- (2) the acceptance of the \$1.5M grant made possible by our federal delegation through the Fiscal Year 2023 Congressional Discretionary process. We have now received the instructions from the US Department of Education to complete the technical application, which is due in early June. This funding will cover both capital and operational costs.
- (3) a \$1.5M American Rescue Plan Career Pathways allocation for use by NHPS, first to cover operational costs and articulation agreements with our partners from Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU) and CT State Gateway Campus (Gateway) that may be associated with BioCity. The balance would be available for any other science-related career pathways, building on the existing momentum at NHPS.

Consistent with President Biden’s Executive Order 13985 on Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities through the Federal Government, the City has underscored the racial wealth gap and opportunities to create intergenerational wealth through the recovery process. The classroom and labs at 101 College Street will be fully furnished and equipped to professional standards, thereby creating a lasting sense of belonging, aspiration and access, all in keeping with the Executive Order.

Already due to the great work of New Haven Public Schools, 15 students have been admitted to the program. The goal is to start the program with an off-site summer camp and then the first cohort would go to 101 College in September, 2024.

Dear President Walker-Myers:

I write to request respectfully that the Honorable Board of Alders (the “Board”) of the City of New Haven (the “City”) approve the above-captioned resolution authorizing the City to assume and, as appropriate, to exercise the powers granted to municipalities under the state’s City and Town Development Act (the “Act”) for a period of five (5) years commencing January 1, 2025.

The purpose of the Act is to allow municipalities to undertake or assist in the financing, development, construction, or reconstruction of housing, industrial, commercial, recreational, transportation, or related service facilities. The Act gives the City the power to purchase, own, and hold, as lessee or lessor, any development property within New Haven. The City also may borrow money, issue bonds, or make loans to sponsors to further the purposes of the Act.

To employ the various powers conferred upon a municipality by the Act, both the governing body of the City and the electorate must approve the use of these powers. The Board last approved the Act in 2019, and the authority of the resolution cannot exceed five (5) years.

The adoption of this resolution after public hearing (information attached) authorizes the City to take advantage of the provisions of the Act after the voters have approved such resolution at referendum. For this question to appear on this November’s ballot for the purposes of such a referendum, the Board must take action on this resolution prior to its September 3, 2024 meeting.

In conclusion, please note that your approval by resolution simply will allow the question of reauthorizing the Act for another five (5) years to appear on this November's ballot for a decision by the voters. If the voters approve of reauthorizing the Act, the Board still will have to approve by resolution individually and specifically any and all future actions that the City might seek to undertake pursuant to the Act.

WHEREAS, on August 8, 1975 the Connecticut General Assembly passed the City and Town Development Act (hereinafter, the "Act") which Act is set forth in Chapter 114 (Sections 7-480 through 7-503) of the Connecticut General Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, the Act provides that municipalities which have found and determined that conditions substantially as described in C.G.S. Section 7-481 exist in the municipality, are continuing, and may be ameliorated by the exercise of the powers granted under the Act; and,

WHEREAS, in order to exercise the powers conferred upon municipalities under the Act for a period which cannot exceed five (5) years, the legislative body of a municipality must determine by resolution that conditions substantially as described in C.G.S. Section 7-481 exist, and such resolution must include certain findings and determinations and standards as required under C.G.S. Section 7-485 for implementation of the powers granted under the Act; and,

WHEREAS, prior to the adoption of such resolution, the Act requires that notice of the proposed resolution be placed on record in the office of the municipal clerk for public inspection, that a summary of the proposed resolution be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality setting forth the time and place of a public hearing thereon, which public hearing must take place not less than five days prior to, and not more than fourteen days subsequent to, the placing on record of such notice and the publication of said summary (the "Notice Requirements"); and,

WHEREAS, as a further condition precedent to exercise of the powers conferred under the Act, the Act requires that following adoption of such resolution, the same shall be submitted to the electors of the municipality at either a special election or at a regular municipal election, if such regular election is held more than sixty days, but not more than one hundred and twenty days, after the adoption of such resolution; and,

WHEREAS, any additional actions taken by a municipality under the provisions of the Act may only be taken after approval of such action by the legislative body of such municipality, which approval must be taken by resolution adopted in accordance with the Act; and,

WHEREAS, all actions taken by a municipality pursuant to the Act are, except as specifically provided for in the Act, subject to all requirements of the General Statutes applicable special acts, local charters and ordinance requirements, including environmental and zoning laws and regulations; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, a municipality shall have the power to issue notes and bonds for achieving the purposes of the Act, including the making of mortgage loans and loans to sponsors, the acquisition of development property, the establishment of reserves to secure such notes and bonds, interest on such notes and bonds during construction and for one year thereafter, and the payment of expenses incident to or necessary for furtherance of the purposes of the Act; and,

WHEREAS, the City of New Haven (the “City”) considers any level of unemployment to be unreasonable, and considers any obsolete residential, industrial, commercial, and manufacturing facilities unacceptable, and continually seeks innovative approaches to attracting new jobs to the City, constructing and holding residential, non-residential, industrial, commercial, and manufacturing facilities, and eliminating vacant facilities which are a blighting influence on the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City finds such conditions to exist and to be ongoing and that the ordinary operations of private enterprise cannot deal effectively with these problems without the powers provided under the Act; and,

WHEREAS, the exercise of the powers conferred upon the City by the Act are critical to revitalizing the City; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the City to implement the provisions of the Act as soon as possible in order to take advantage of the provisions of the Act; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that the resolution required under the provisions of the Act as a condition precedent to the exercise of the powers conferred by the Act be submitted to the electors of this City at the next regular municipal election; and,

WHEREAS, the Notice Requirements have been duly satisfied and, pursuant thereto, the City’s Development Commission has held a public hearing concerning this proposed resolution seeking to confer upon the City the powers provided by the Act, and the Development Commission has made available to the Board of Alders its report pertaining to the findings and determinations arising therefrom; and,

WHEREAS, members of the Board of Alders are generally familiar with studies and documents that have been prepared previously relating to the housing and unemployment problems within the City, the obsolescence of many of New Haven’s residential, commercial, industrial and manufacturing facilities; and,

WHEREAS, members of the Board of Alders have general knowledge of the conditions within the City relating to the rate of unemployment, the obsolescence of many of New Haven’s residential,

commercial, industrial and manufacturing facilities and the need for the City to retain and attract new residential, commercial, industrial and manufacturing facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Alders is generally aware of the requirements imposed upon municipalities by the Act.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. that the Board of Alders of the City makes the following findings and legislative determinations:
 - a) that conditions substantially as described in C.G.S. Section 7-481 exist in the City, are continuing and may be ameliorated by the exercise of the powers granted under the Act;
 - b) that it is unreasonable that any number of residents of the City are subject to hardship in finding employment and adequate, safe and sanitary housing; and that such conditions exist and persist within the City;
 - c) that conditions of blight in the City should be addressed, and that an unreasonable number of the existing residential units and industrial, commercial and manufacturing facilities within the City are obsolete, inefficient or dilapidated, and that the existence of such structures create conditions of deterioration and blight in the City;
 - d) that there exists within the City a critical shortage of adequate housing which is the result of declines in new housing starts and existence of a large number of substandard, unsafe and unsanitary dwellings and that an unreasonable number of residents of the municipality are subject to hardship in finding adequate, safe and sanitary housing;
 - e) that there exists within the City an unreasonable number of abandoned residential, non-residential, commercial, industrial, and manufacturing facilities;
 - f) that private enterprise, using ordinary methods, is not meeting the needs of the City in the areas of housing, employment and the reduction of deterioration and blight;
 - g) that the need for employment and adequate, safe and sanitary housing will be lessened and the City will be revitalized by exercising the powers granted under the Act.
2. that the Board of Alders sets the following standards for the implementation of the powers granted under the Act and declares that no action will be taken by the City under the powers conferred by the Act unless the following conditions have been met:

- a) adequate provisions have been made for the payment of the cost of acquisition, construction, operation, maintenance and insurance of all development property, as the same as defined under the Act;
 - b) a feasible method exists and will be utilized for the relocation into safe and sanitary dwellings of comparable rent of families and individuals displaced as a consequence of the exercise of any power granted under the Act, and such families and individuals shall not suffer disproportionate injuries as a result of the actions authorized by the Act for the public benefit;
 - c) no development property will be acquired or disposed of without due consideration of the environmental and economic impact of such acquisition or disposition and the adequacy of existing or proposed municipal services; and
 - d) the acquisition or disposition of all development property shall advance the public interest, general health, safety and welfare, and development growth and prosperity of the City.
3. that anything contained in this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, it is the intention of this Board of Alders that by adopting this Resolution it is conferring upon the City, subject to approval of a majority of the persons voting on this Resolution at the next regular municipal election, all of the powers, rights and obligations conferred upon municipalities under the provisions of the Act, and that upon approval of this Resolution by a majority of persons voting on this Resolution as aforesaid, the City will have sufficiently complied with the Act so as to be able to exercise all of the powers conferred upon municipalities under the Act in accordance with the Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor, City/Town Clerk of the City of New Haven, and the Registrar of Voters are hereby authorized to take any and all steps necessary to place this Resolution on the ballot at the next regular municipal election held subsequent to the adoption of this Resolution in accordance with the provisions of the Act and Section 9-369a of the Connecticut General Statutes, Revision of 1958, as amended, including but not limited to warning electors, preparing ballot labels, holding the referendum and canvassing the vote on this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with Section 9-369a of the Connecticut General Statutes, the question will read as follows:

“Shall the City of New Haven, as authorized by the Board of Alders, continue to undertake programs and projects under the City and Town Development Act, Chapter 114 of the Connecticut General Statutes Section 7-480 et. seq. of the Connecticut General Statutes?”

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall become effective upon its approval by a majority of persons voting on this Resolution at the next regular municipal election held subsequent

I am pleased to submit, for the Honorable Board's review, the attached proposal for an "Orange Street Lighting Project" and other documents, which represent a proposed installation of overhead canopy lights installed on Orange Street, from Center Street to Crown Street, in Downtown New Haven. I respectfully request that the Honorable Board of Alders of the City of New Haven accept this submission for its consideration.

Town Green Special Services District, in partnership with Beacon Properties LLC ("Beacon"), proposes a conceptual improvement of the street lighting on Orange Street between Center Street and Crown Street, through the implementation of overhead canopy lighting.

There are many community benefits to this proposal. It:

- Helps to improve the visual appeal of this important urban zone through ambiance lighting.
- Improves the walkability factor and pedestrian appeal of the Ninth Square.
- Illuminates businesses and storefronts after hours, as well as visually unifies this section of Orange Street after dark.
- Creates additional lighting for the more than 20 events that Ninth Square hosts a year.
- Solidifies the Ninth Square as its own neighborhood with unique identity.

This project will be installed by a third-party contractor, E. J. Davis Aesthetics LLC, utilizing a lift and appropriate hardware to anchor into sixteen (16) points, approximately twenty-two feet (22') above the street into the brick walls, crisscrossing across Orange Street. Stainless steel wire will be attached to these anchors in order to provide the structure of the lighting project. Light strings will then be attached to the stainless-steel wire. These light strings will be electrified by Beacon and will be on a timer set by Beacon.
